KARL W. WENINGER, 57, passed away at home on December 17, 2011, after living 15 months with a glioblastoma brain cancer. Dearest husband of Susan for 19 years. Loving father of Alicia, Matthew, Christopher Myers, Timothy (Lauren) Myers, and Katie (Dustin) Wilkins. "Papa" of Jack Myers and uncle to many. Cherished son of Andrew (deceased) and Blanka. Karl was a Catholic priest in the Diocese of Cleveland serving at St. Helen in Newbury and St. Gregory the Great in South Euclid.
