And it reminded me he liked to race us in 95 degree heat on the beach and he was the only one who the heat didn't get to. Pretty impressive.

His parents definitely raised one amazingly tough kid. And now it is the parents, grandparents and so many more that have to be tough at the worst possible time. On the worst possible day. But, that don't have to be tough by themselves. We are here as a community and don't forget it.
